Nickel leads Ontario mining

In 1985, the total value of metallic and non-metallic minerals produced in Ontario was \$3.66 billion.

Nickel was the leading mineral, with a total value of \$968 million. This was followed by copper at \$554 million and uranium at \$519 million.

Gold, zinc and iron ore also made up major components of Ontario's 1985 mineral production. Gold production was valued at \$440 million; zinc at \$341 million and iron ore at \$227 million.
