However, if your child starts a pattern of aggressive behaviour (such as lying, stealing or fighting), and if these behaviours carry on frequently for longer than six months, it may be a cause for concern.

Help from your family doctor or a mental health professional may be necessary.

In many instances, a little support is all that is necessary to get things back on the road with your kids.
