Calgary will have the XV Winter Olympics

Reeve Mike Cosgrove spoke for a few minutes to start the celebrations, followed by a huge bonfire,

in the individual category with her torch bearer. Unfortunately, warmer weather started to melt the poor runner.

First place in the group category went to the employees of Birch's with their Hidy and Howdy sculpture. Second place in the group went to the firemen and their torch which was seen by all in the recreation complex parking lot.
