The Olympic torch arrived in Terrace Bay on a chilly Monday afternoon to a very packed Simcoe Plaza.

One of the most noted events in Terrace Bay leading up to the arrival of the torch was the *Games of Winter Play*, part of the Entertainment Series.

The show was held at the Terrace Bay campus of Lake Superior High School, and played to a very enthusiastic crowd, said Dean Main, Terrace Bay recreation director.

Main said there were approximately 170 people in attendance for the show at 7 p.m. on Sunday, January 10.

The show was a fast-paced comedy with music, song, drama, and even a little skating.

A highlight of the show was the skating performance by Michael Shinniman (show skater).
