game of cards.

If the weather is nasty, she may hail a ride with friends, but most of the time she can be seen walking the five or six blocks to the club from her home.

Over the years, Mrs. Campbell has been very active as president of the Catholic Women's League, Women's Institute, Cancer Society, and the Ladies' Auxiliary to the Royal Canadian Legion.

Now that she is a senior, she's still active in the Chimo Club and manages to sell at least 100 home bingo cards for the club.

According to her daughter, Mrs. Helen Leblanc, she can also be found selling tickets for others who may need help in ticket sales, and in September, she was out canvassing door-to-door for the Arthritis Society.

Mrs. Campbell also manages to keep track of her family's birthdays and anniversaries and sends cards for all occasions to them and dozens of friends.

During Christmas, Mrs. Campbell made Christmas cakes, mince tarts and puddings, and shared them with her family and friends.
