Crime of the week #04 Break, enter and theft-Candy Mountain Road

On December 2, 1985, between 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., a large theft occurred on Candy Mountain Road, Paipoonge Township, near the Candy Mountain Ski Hill.

The fence at the end of the driveway had been cut with bolt cutters and once on the property, the house, as well as several storage sheds, had been entered.

Stolen from the residence were approximately 20 firearms, including rifles, shotguns, a German-made rifle, a Russian army rifle, and a Canadian Jungle Carbine rifle.

Also stolen were five, 25-horsepower Mercury outboard motors in their shipping crates, and a 1984 Ski-doo Safari, which was driven from the scene.

A red "Beach" mechanics roller tool chest containing miscellaneous hand tools, and power tools were also stolen.

A number of "Mono-pro" axes, a \$500 Canada Savings Bond, and a 133-ounce liquor bottle, full of silver coinage, were also taken.

In total, \$30,000 worth of property was stolen, and none has been recovered.

The majority of these articles are identifiable.

Since the time of the theft, measures for increased security at the residence have been taken, including the installation of an alarm system.

Crimestoppers will pay up to \$1,000, this week, for information that leads to the arrest of the person responsible for this crime.


