January 10, 1987. While Easterners were digging out of yet another snowstorm, Calgarians were mowing their lawns, riding their bikes and sunning themselves in outdoor cafes.

Calgary's temperature soared to 17 degrees, about 2 degrees higher than at Las Vegas. Skiers, that is snow skiers, were lamenting the July weather.

February 26, 1984- A pleasant Saturday night snowfall in Ottawa was said to have inspired Canada's Prime Minister, Pierre Elliot Trudeau, to decide to leave Canadian politics.

The weekend snow was light by Ottawa standards, 6.3 centimetres

with a temperature of -40 degrees.

March 27, 1987- Easterly winds pushed the pack ice, which normally remains off the coast of Nova Scotia, into Halifax harbour for the first time in 27 years.

Marine traffic was disrupted, including ferry service between

Halifax and Dartmouth.

April 11, 1987- Maple syrup production in Eastern Canada was down drastically, owing to the mild spring and the lack of freezing night time temperatures.

May 22, 1987- Rick Hansen arrived in Vancouver under perfect weather; sunny skies, excellent visibility, temperature of 17 degrees and winds southwest at 11 kilometres per hour.

More than 10,000 persons welcomed the man in motion to the place where the tour began 26 months and 40,000 kilometres ago.

June 29, 1963- A remarkable one-day snowfall of 111.8 centimetres

occurred at Livingstone Ranger Station, Alberta. For several years this stood as the greatest all-time one-day snowfall

ever recorded in Canada.

July 15, 1928- Near Constance, Saskatchewan, hailstones the size of teacups lashed a ranch killing more than 750 animals by crushing their skulls and bodies.

Three horses were also killed and a sheep herder was forced to cover his head with the saddle to save his life.



Few clubs met as many challenges as Ottawa's famed Silver Seven, who became the Senators in 1906.

In all, Ottawa captured 9 Stanley Cups between 1893 and 1934, when they folded and moved to St. Louis as the Eagles for 1934/35.

Some famous Senators in history included Punch Broadbent, Cy Dinney, Alex Connell, Frank Nighbor, Frank Boucher, Hooley Smith, Cyclone Taylor and Clint Benedict.

Ottawa's Silver Seven/Senators stand 3rd among Stanley Cup Champions in history...behind the Canadiens (23) and the Maple Leafs (13).

During the W.H.A. period, the Civics, and later the Nationals, tried to establish root in the capital city. Both failed for the same reason as the oldtime Senators; a lack of fans.

If junior hockey is any indication, an W.H.L. franchise for Ottawa might be viable in the future. Hull'o Olympiques and the '67s both draw well at the gate.

The Eagles, as grandfather to the St. Louis Blues, lasted only one year and won fewer than 10 games.

One of their players, Syd Howe (no relation to Gordie!) became a proficient scorer for the great Red Wings clubs of '36, '37, and '43, and was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame.

The oldest existing NHL franchise? That's an easy one for Montreal fans. The ancient blue and white Canadiens were formed in 1909 and started playing in the N.H.A. in 1910.

"Les Glorieux", as the Flying Frenchmen are called today, hadn't any red in their original uni-

green maple leaf one season as a crest! When the Habs won the silverware in '16, their crest was a CA rather than the familiar CH.

It stood for the Canadiens' Athletic Club (in English). In 1924/25, the Habs had a globe to replace the CH. This showed they were Stanley Cup Champions and the world's champions of hockey (which they were).

When Norris brought out the Red Wing uniforms in 1933, fans complained bitterly Canadien/Red Wing matchups. The Habs and Wings both looked alike.

By 1934, the Canadiens wore white uniforms at home against Detroit, and the Wings reciprocated at the Olympic Stadium in Motor City.

By 1944, the Canadiens often wore their famous white uniforms as visiting teams to other cities. Canadiens are not only the oldest surviving Stanley Cup champions; they won their first cup before any of the surviving franchises of the NHL were born.

Les Habitants are the mostextraordinary franchise in all professional sports; eclipsing the Yanks of baseball and the Celtics basketball-Montreal Canadiens- the best-known sports franchise in the world.

As for Ottawa, it remains a hotbed for hockey mania. Someday, the Senators may return to the NHL...at least folks in Ottawa/Hull can dream about the return to Stanley Cup glories.
