Fire pumper soon replaced

Council noted at this meeting that the 1971 Fire Pumper will soon be in need of replacement, and that the budgeted contribution to reserves should be increased from the \$4,000 per year now contributed. Equipment required to complete the Hazardous Goods Emergency Response vehicle is on order, and phase two of the project will be completed this year.

Cemetery meeting held soon

A Cemetery Committee meeting will be held as soon as possible to review budgetary requirements for 1988. Work will proceed on the acquisition land and an operating agreement with the Township of Terrace Bay, whereby the township will be permitted to maintain a cemetery within the boundaries of Terrace Bay.

Cul-Du-Sac to be paved

Meetings will be held as soon as possible, with the owners of land to be acquired for the Walker Lake Road Widening, and the entrance to Highway 17 at Winnipeg Street. Clerk Aurel Gauthier was instructed to obtain additional information on the status of land at Main Street and Drummond, forming part of R-219, and the CPR Block of Land.

Gauthier was instructed to advise homeowners on Park Place that the township intends to proceed with the paving of the Cul-du-Sac this year to MTC standards. Council requested that the township be advised if homeowners wish to absorb the cost of providing additional paving to the limit of the street allowance.

Snow plow truck to be budgeted

The resolution was carried that an application be made to the Ministry of Transportation and Communications for subsidy funding for the 1988 Budget Year. Proposed expenditures for 1988 are:

Resolution 88-20 was carried that the township apply to the MTC for a supplementary allocation of subsidy money, during the 1988 Budget year, for the purpose of purchasing a snow plow truck, plow and wing harness, sand and gravel box and sander; said truck to be used for snow removal, street sanding and gravel hauling for the township roads; estimated cost, \$90,000.

Rents increased

Council reviewed the rents being charged to various township properties and a motion was carried for an increase. Rent on the following properties has been increased by \$25 for 1988: Hydro Commission, \$200; Community Services, \$200; N.S. Mental Health, \$505; Doctor's Office, Thunder Bay Health Unit, \$200; and N.S. Ambulance, \$372.
