The race, he said, is 700 metres in length (a quarter-mile) and there are different categories to suit the engine sizes of the machines.

1,200 blocks of ice are used to make it as well as some fibreglass and plastic.

The girls said a restaurant and several dance floors are contained in the palace.

"It glitters with light," they said.

For 10 days ice sculptures are created on this road in lower Quebec, "to see who can make the best ice sculpture," he said.

No cars are allowed to drive on that street for the 10 days but a small train does carry tourists there, said Moorey.


