Schreiber- March 8

Examining cemetery issue

· A motion was passed prohibiting future sales of plots while both spouses are still living. Council is concerned about lack of available land, and will discuss the possibility of obtaining space from Terrace Bay. The budget for the cemetery was set at \$31,580.

Council will look at the responses to a questionnaire being distributed this week dealing with cemetery concerns.

Fire budget to be split

• Council decided to separate the budget of the Fire Brigade. The Fire Operations portion is \$51,500, while the EMO (Emergency Measures Organization) budget was slated for \$5,000, for a combined total of \$56,500. The town received a 'Jaws of Life.' This piece of equipment will aid rescuers in removing accident victims from cars.

Hydro representation?

 Council will hold a meeting with Terrace Bay to establish the make-up of the representation on the Hydro commission. The question of whether Schreiber and Terrace Bay each has its own representative or must select one person to represent both communities will be established.

Individual banned from rec complex

 Council passed a motion banning an individual from attending any event at the Recreation Complex for three years. The individual had been suspended for various lengths of time in the past due to causing disturbances. The individual will not be allowed to attend weddings or other social events, but will be allowed on the baseball field.

• The final draft of the Recreation Plan will be incorporated into the Master Plan.

Garbage service discussed

· Council discussed at length the apparent problems associated with late and inconsistent garbage pick-up. The contractor has been contacted by the council in the past, and the council members acknowledged a letter of complaint from the Legion about garbage pick-up. Council will meet with the contractor to try solving the problem. Town Administrator Aurel Gauthier noted: "Garbage is like dogs; it's a problem the municipality has always had.

Keep the water running

· Council noted that repairs were made on March 8 after the second freeze-up of the year

· Council will expect the first detailed report on design brief alternatives for the Water Treatment Plant by March 10.

Free snow removal available

• There is still a free snow shovelling service available to senior citizens (65 years of age or older), and to the handicapped. To be eligible, you cannot have another wage earner in the residence. Contact the municipal office for further information.


