Booklet designed for landlords and tenants

A new information booklet designed to inform tenants and landlords in Ontario of their rights and obligations has been produced by the Ministry of Housing in response to some 300,000 inquiries received in 1987.

"A Guide to the Landlord and Tenant Act" focuses on residential rental units and aspects of the Act dealing with such issues as leases, security deposits, evictions, subletting, and repair and maintenance of apartments.

Staff at 21 local rent review offices located throughout the province field some 500,000

inquiries a year about landlord and tenant matters.

More than half the questions are about issues that the Landlord and Tenant Act covers. The Act was amended last June to extend protection to roomers, boarders, and lodgers.
