Women in Management

Treasury Board President Don Mazankowski announced on March 9 that the federal government has reached its first major hiring target for women in the Management Category of the Public Service.

The government has been striving to more than double the number of women in the Management Category from 217 in 1983 to 475 by March 31, 1988. As of March 8, the number of women in the Management Category was 509.

"The government's goal is to ensure that women are full participants in all areas of the Federal Public Service," said Mr. Mazankowski. "We have worked together with the Public Service Commission to achieve this milestone with respect to senior positions in the Public Service."

"By April, we will set new targets for the next three years. These targets will cover the Management Category, non-traditional occupations and other groups where women are under-represented. We are eager to continue the progress made to date," said Mazankowski.

He also took this opportunity to note other initiatives of interest to women:

- The mandate of the Women's Career Counselling and Referral Bureau at the PSC has been extended until March 31, 1993. This bureau has been instrumental in identifying and referring women for appointments into the management category.

- Together with the 13 Public Service unions, the government has launched one of the largest equal pay studies ever involving more than 4,400 employees. The results of this study, expected in late 1989,

could positively affect the wages of 81,000 employees in predominantly female occupational groups.

"These are a few of the steps

this government is pursuing to make women full and equitable partners in the Public Service workforce," said Mazankowski.
