from July 25 to August 12.

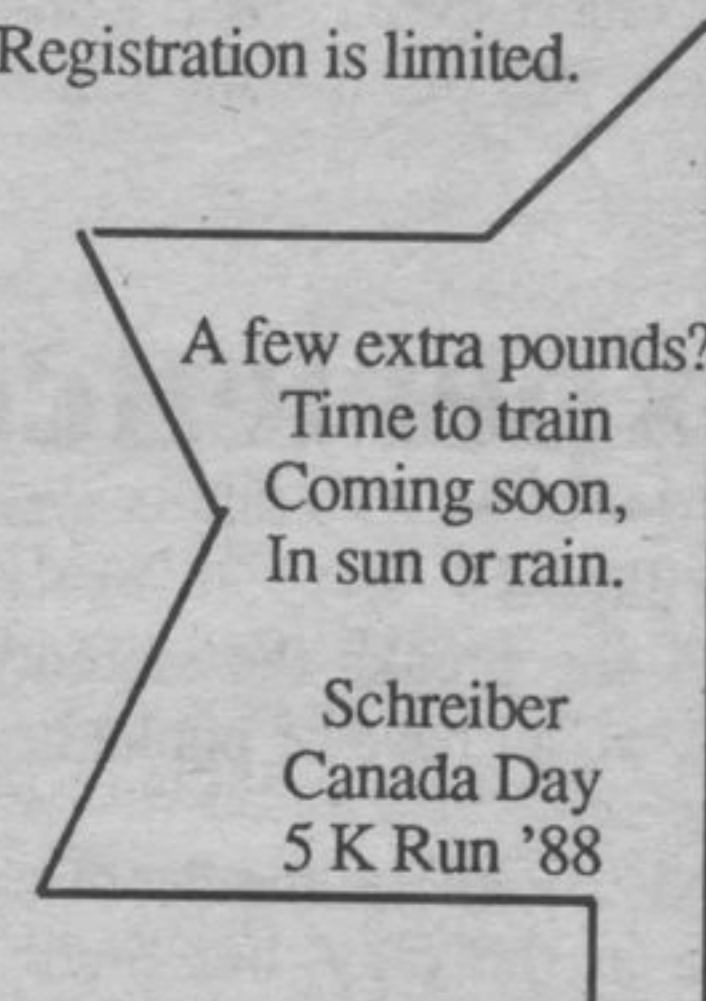
**First Aid Course**
