Welcome Spring with a delightfully fresh-tasting and beautifully presented dinner for guests. Red snapper fillets are lightly broiled or grilled and served atop a pool of creamy green onion sauce. Rosemary Vegetables Dijon are a delicately-seasoned and colorful accompaniment.

Red Snapper Fillets With Green Onion

1	can (10 oz/284 mL) Campbell's Condensed Cream of Celery Soup	1
1/2 cup	milk	125 mL
1/3 cup	white wine	75 mL
1/2 cup	chopped green onion	125 mL
2 tbsp	lemon juice	25 mL
2 tsp	butter or margarine	10 mL
2 tsp	flour	10 mL
2 lb	red snapper fillets, broiled	1 kg
	dill sprigs for garnish (optional)	

To prepare sauce: In 2 qt (2 L) saucepan over medium heat combine soup, milk and wine; mix well. Add green onion; simmer 1 minute.

Puree soup mixture until smooth in a blender container or food processor; stir in lemon juice.

Melt butter in a saucepan; blend in flour. Gradually add sauce. Heat through, stirring constantly. Force through fine sieve.

For each serving, place about 1/4 cup (50 mL) sauce on each plate; top with fish. Garnish with dill. Serves 8.
