Some of the winners of the Science Fair held at the Terrace Bay Public School

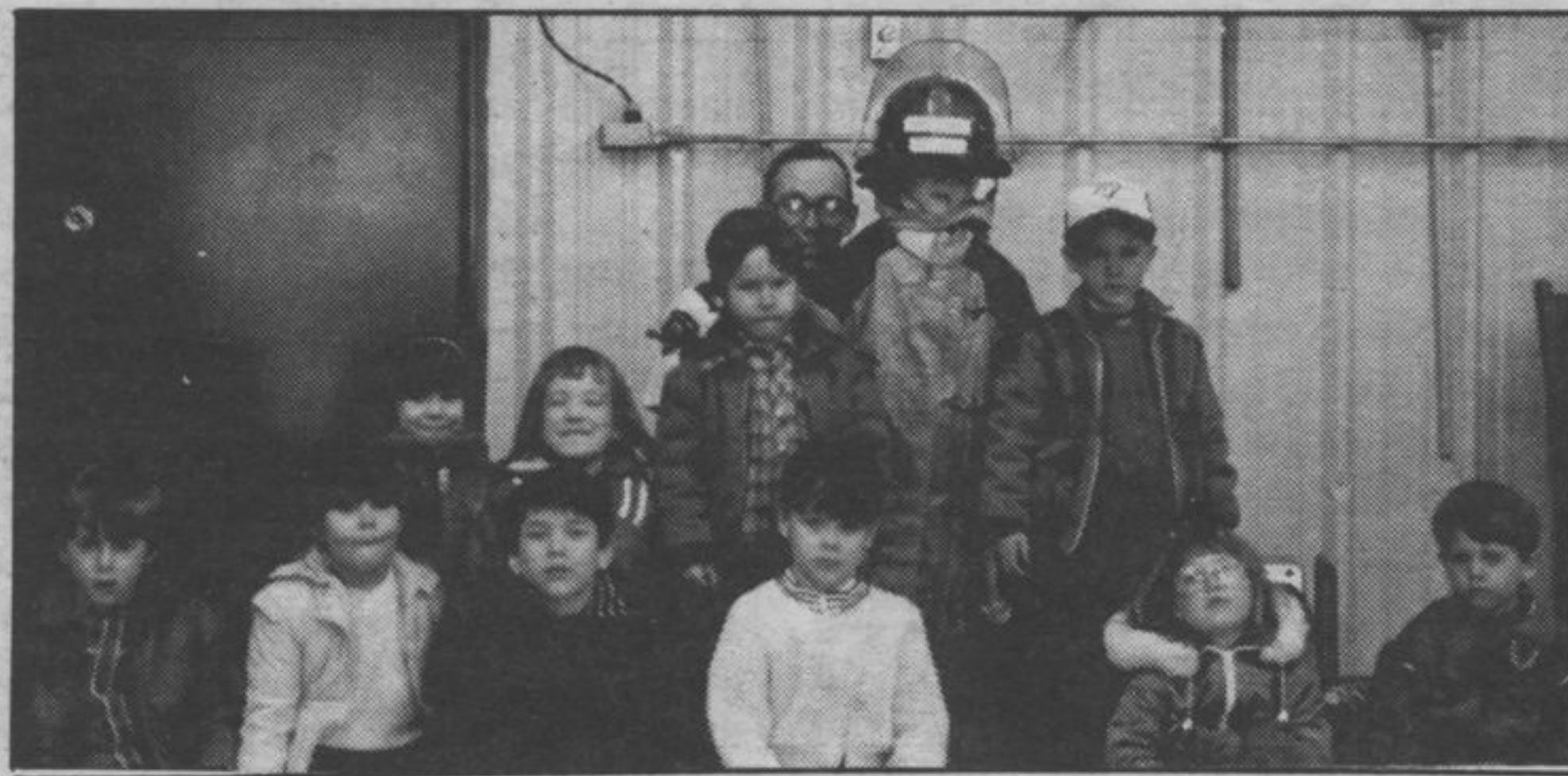


Wendy Soppel and Mari Gimmel (absent) did research on how ingredients affect the making of a cake.
