## Rossport betters firefighting services

The local services board of Rossport will receive a \$1,400 provincial grant to purchase additional fire equipment, Northern

Development Minister Rene Fountaine has announced.

Rossport will apply the Northern Development and Mines grant to the cost of a fire hydrant near the Rossport Inn and a stand pipe near the pump house. The community will raise \$1,400 for the balance of the equipment's cost.

"These fixtures will mean an assured supply of water for Rossport's volunteer team in the west and east sections of the community," Fountaine said. "they will also provide added protection for the Rossport Inn, an historical landmark in the area."

# Terrace Bay Police Report

Break and Enter investigated

Two individuals were charged with Break and Enter after police concluded an investigation related to an unauthorized entry of the Terrace Bay Post Office on April 6. Under the Young Offenders Act, the names of the individuals cannot be published.

Rash of crimes being investigated

Chief D. Kidder said there has been an unusual increase in "smaller type" crimes, which are being presently investigated. The chief said that younger residents appear to be involved, and attributed it to "Spring Fever. Police action is being taken," he said.

Notice of Caution policy adopted

Terrace Bay police have started a policy whereby residents may receive a caution rather than being charged. Chief Kidder said it is hoped this policy will accomplish three objectives: it should indicate actual policing reports; it should treat people more fairly; and it will be for people "worthy of receiving a caution." Chief Kidder said it will also ensure that an individual receives only one caution for any incident.

Terrace Bay police investigated a total of 95 occurrences to April 20.


