Response to lack of home health care needed now

Dear editor:

Home health care is one of the most humane and cost effective ways of providing care to the sick and elderly. It allows individuals to be cared for in the comfort of their own homes and results in a positive financial impact on the total health care system.

Unfortunately, the providers of this vital service are threatened by a critical shortage of staff to supply home health care and support. Essentially, the problem is that the service is underfunded by the government, and the agencies supplying the service cannot offer high enough wages to attract staff.

People are the backbone of the home health care delivery system. To ensure the integrity of home care service, there is a need for training programs and competitive wages and benefits.

The issue is one of money, distributed in a fair and equitable manner. The challenge is one of laying the foundation to move from local and regional programs, equitable and thoughtfully to a co-ordinated provincial effort.

The government has recognized the problem and responded by requesting the Interministerial Review Committee Report on Ontario Homemaking Services. Personnel from five provincial. ministries in consultation with interested groups produced a report last fall addressing the critical issues of wages, education, the rate setting process and rate structure.

Tragically the government has not yet released this report or taken any action to address the issues.

Surely a report which would focus attention of the needs of this vital health care sector should not be delayed. Nor should a piecemeal approach to this province-wide challenge be accepted.

A response which addresses these critical challenges within the scope of an equitable, provincial system is needed now.




