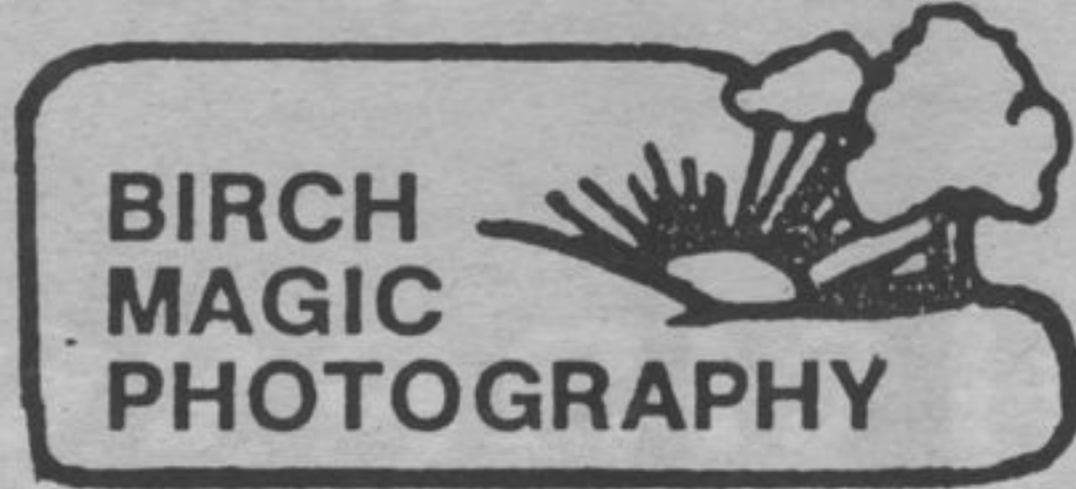


# A Northshore Photographer's Portfolio

These aspects of light are the photographer's strongest creative tools. Light is affected by time,

Choose a subject that interests and excites you and study it from every point of view. It takes time to study lines, shapes, composition and to perceive patterns and textures.

will see colour patterns and moods created by light. Concentrate on tiny details that are often overlooked.

Your life may become enriched as you become increasingly aware of the beauty of the common and small, and this art will be reflected in your work.
