

Over 30,000 hunters bag MNR validation tags

The Ministry of Natural Resources has mailed 31,694 cow and bull validation tags to hunters for the 1988 moose hunt.

The annual draw for moose validation tags was held June 30, and all of the 80,886 hunters who put their names on the 1988 draw will be notified by the end of July whether or not they receive tags.

The draw is part of the ministry's Moose Selective Harvest Program, which was initiated in 1983 to allow the moose population to rebuild.

The random draw for tags in 68 Wildlife Management Units with moose seasons in Ontario ensures a fair allocation of moose hunting opportunities.

During the second and third weeks of August, hunters who applied but were not successful in this year's draw will be given a chance to obtain one of the 4,017 surplus tags. This will bring the total of 1988 tags to 35,711.

Nipigon and Manitowadge.

She told the *News* that the key issues among communities in the North are essentially the same. She has heard opinions expressed on long-term economic development and diversification, waterfront development along the North shore of Lake Superior, and the need for

Notice to Residents of the Township of Terrace Bay Regulation Made Under the Planning Act, 1983 Ontario Regulation No. 462/88

Take notice that on July 13, 1988, the Minister of Municipal Affairs made a Zoning Order, pursuant to subsection 46(1) of the Planning Act, 1983.

The Order covers Part of location JK 300, designated as Part 1 of Parcel 8442 on plan 55R-7495, entered in Thunder Bay Freehold, in the Land Registry Office for the Land Titles Division of Thunder Bay (No. 55).

The Order regulates the use of land and the erection and use of buildings and structures on the subject lands to permit the construction of a waste treatment facility to be used by Kimberly-Clark of Canada Limited.

This Zoning Order is a temporary land use control requested by the Township of Terrace Bay. It is proposed that the Zoning Order will be revoked when the municipal zoning by-law has been amended.

Any new construction or use of land in contravention of the Order may result in a fine of up to \$20,000 for the first conviction and \$10,000 per day for a subsequent conviction. A court order prohibiting the continuation or repetition of a contravention may also be made.

Your attention is directed to the following subsections of section 46 of The Planning Act, 1983:

- (8) The Minister may, on his own initiative, or at the request of any person, by Order, amend or revoke in whole or in part any Order made under subsection (1).
- (9) Except as provided in subsection (10), the Minister, before amending or revoking in whole or in part an Order made under subsection (1), shall give notice or cause to be given notice thereof in such manner as he considers proper and shall allow such period of time as he considers appropriate for the submission of representations in respect thereof; and,
- (10) Where an application is made to the Minister to amend or revoke in whole or in part any Order made under subsection (1), the Minister may, and on the request of any person, shall request the Municipal Board to hold a hearing on the application and thereupon the Board shall hold a hearing as to whether the Order should be amended or revoked in whole or in part.
