This will give you a complete Thunder Bay area road condition report.

Winter weather can cause a variety of hazardous driving conditions by dumping snow and ice on our roads. At this time driver skills are put to the test. Here are five DRIVING TIPS.

1) on packed snow or ice, start gently and gradually & try not to spin the tires. Keep wheels straight ahead to ease starting.

2) Get the feel of the road quickly when at slow speeds. Try a light speed increase and test braking to determine the available traction.

3) If you skid, **RELEASE THE ACCELERATOR**, and steer in the direction you want your car to go. **DON'T BRAKE**, the front wheels must be kept rolling in order to steer. **DO** put automatic transmission in neutral or declutch and try to gear down with a standard.

4) Most accidents in SCHREIBER/TERRACE BAY area caused from "SPEED TOO FAST." Posted speed limits are for ideal conditions, that ideal does not refer to Northern Ontario winters. In the winter sometimes half of the posted speed might be too much.

5) **SEE and BE SEEN.** Clean and defrost your windows, and the lights. Use your low beam headlights even during daylight hours.

On 2nd of November Judge Mitchell presided during a busy session.
