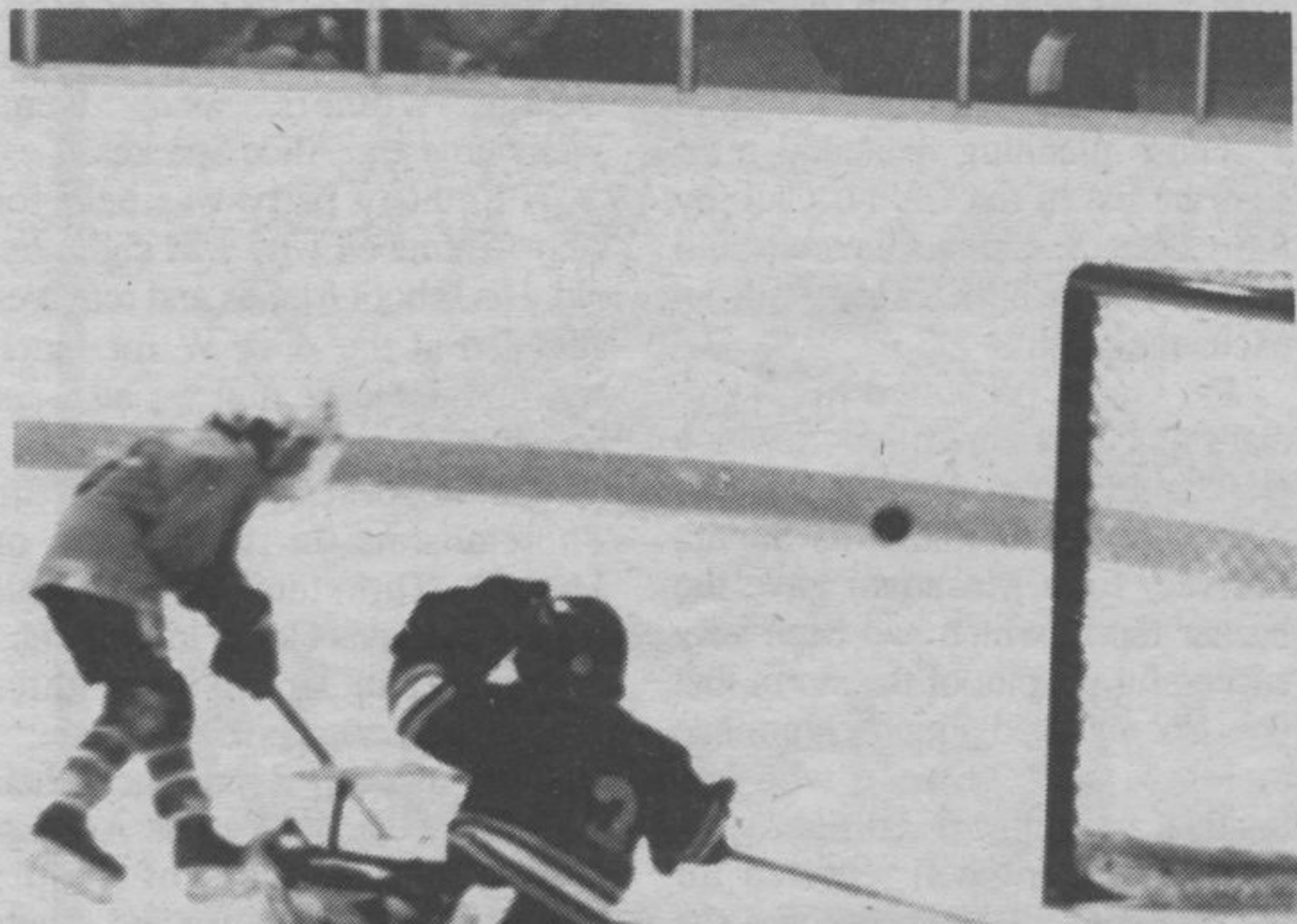


Hockey tournament doesn't go well for Terrace Bay teams
