Advances in trapping increase humanity

"That's why I like coming to the workshops. You learn something new every time. It sure improves the quality of the fur going out now," said Riddell.

Riddell said that trappers rarely use leg hold traps anymore.

"Now we use the quick kill traps," he said.

These traps catch the animal by the back and the neck and causes death in about 10 to 15 seconds said Riddell.

"The traps are much more humane than before," he added.

Riddell said the definition of a humane trap is one that causes death or irreversible unconsciousness in three minutes or less.

He said there is constant testing and revisions being done to traps to make them more humane.

For example, the leg hold trap with teeth is now illegal. Both Riddell and Garneau said they each have hundreds of these traps in their garages that are now useless.

Current leg hold traps are similar to the ones with teeth. Instead of teeth though, there is just a flat piece of steel which is covered with rubber. Garneau has demonstrated this trap in the past, using his arm.

"Last year I demonstrated it all day long and only had a small bruise at the end of the day," said Garneau.

These new traps are called soft hold traps. Riddell gave an excellent example of their benefits.

He explained that one day he was checking his traps and found a large Husky caught in one of them. He contacted the owner of the dog who came to release him, and the dog's paw wasn't even bruised.

So, although it's an old occupation, there are new advances being made to make it more humane and profitable.
