Council supports fundraiser

The last Terrace Bay Council meeting saw Ron Running, District Manager, Ministry of Natural Resources, Ken McQuatters, Senior Technician with the MNR and James Harrison, Chief Forester, Kimberly-Clark, review K.C.'s five-years Timber Management Plan.

Discussed were the areas in the Terrace Bay district that K.C. will cut over the next five years. They also showed maps to indicate where any extra roads may

be built to reach this forested area.

Roy Teniuk presented a progress report on his waterskiing trip across Lake Superior which will be used to raise funds for Muscular Dystrophy.

Teniuk requested that council hire a student to assist with the promotion.

May 16, there will be a door-to-door blitz to get pledges and donations. The ski will start at the light house at Copper Harbor, Michigan and will end at the Terrace Bay beach - a run of 177 km.

There are 16 volunteer Fire Departments already involved to help raise money for MD.

Council has loaned the local Fire Department \$2,000 for the Water Ski Project all of which will be paid back, interest free, by September 30, 1989. This money will provide a working capital to buy such items as hats, buttons, T-shirts and sweatshirts.

O'Brian International is making and donating the skis and equipment for this venture.

Local bulk fuel businesses are being approached to supply the fuel needed for the trip.

The town council also received a Thank You for their donation to the North Shore Community Band, which was in the amount of \$5,000.

Concerning a Proposed Zoning By-Law Amendment

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Terrace Bay will hold a public meeting on Monday, June 5, 1989, at 6:30 p.m. at the Terrace Bay Municipal Office, 12 Simcoe Plaza, to consider a proposed zoning by-law amendment under Section 34 of the Planning Act.

The proposed zoning by-law amendment would change the zone category of 88.23 hectares of land east of the Kimberly-Clark of Canada Limited pulp mill from "A" (Rural) to "MP" (Paper Products Industrial) to permit the construction of an aerated lagoon to provide secondary treatment of effluent from the pulp mill.

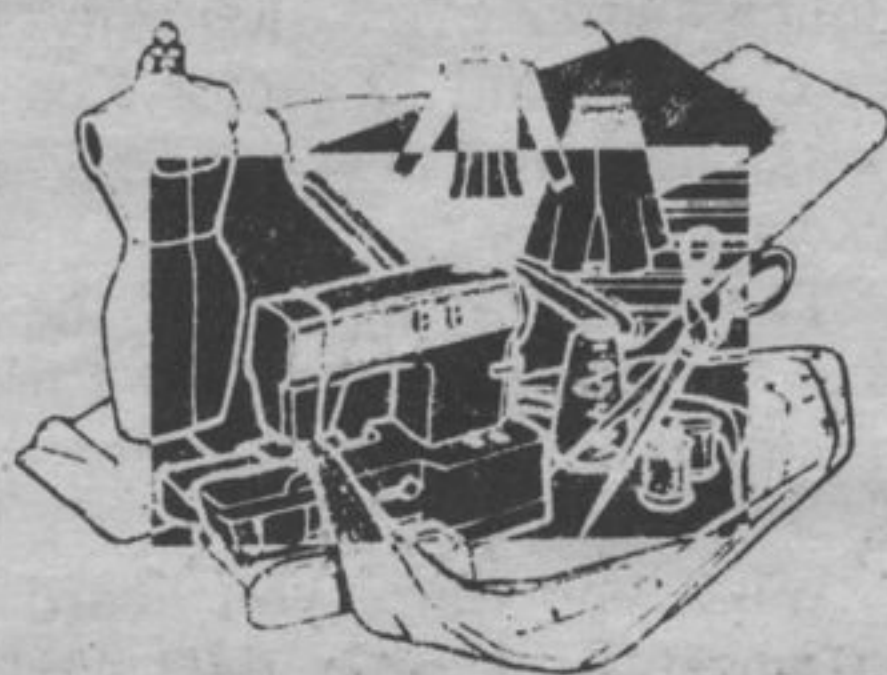
ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and/or make written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed zoning by-law amendment.

Sewing Tips



Acetate Care: Drycleaning may be preferred. Remove oily stains before washing. Heat in washing, drying, or pressing may set stains permanently. Use low temperature in laundering and ironing. Sensitive to heat in ironing.

Acrylic Care: Can be drycleaned, is machine washable, and is dryable at moderate temperature. Check label. Reduce static electricity by using a fabric softener.

Metallic Care: If washable, either hand or machine washing is successful. Iron at low temperature. Drycleanable.

Nylon Care: Machine washable and dries at low temperatures. Scavenges color. (Wash whites separately.)

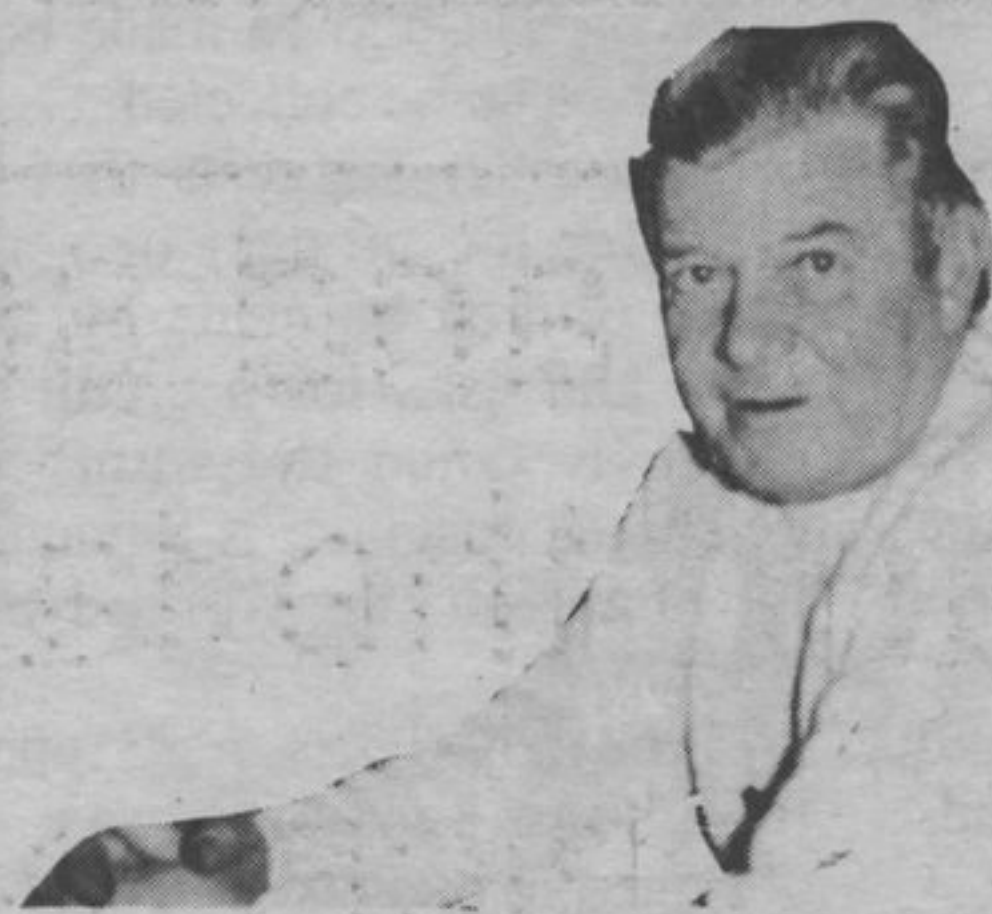
