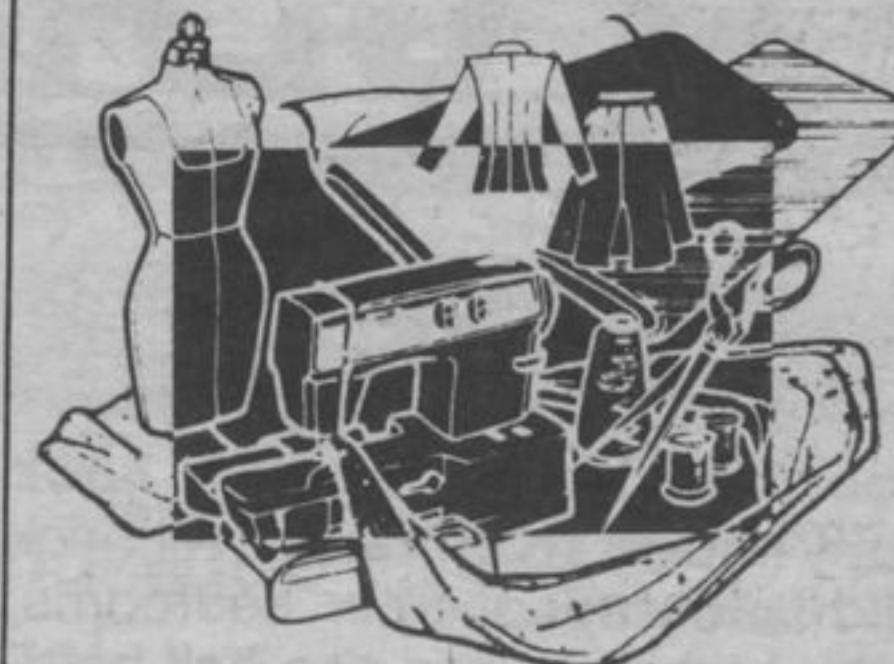
mane method of destroying pups. Vets in Thunder Bay will put a pup to sleep for a slight fee and the puppies do not suffer in the process.

Township of Terrace Bay BUILDING PERMITS

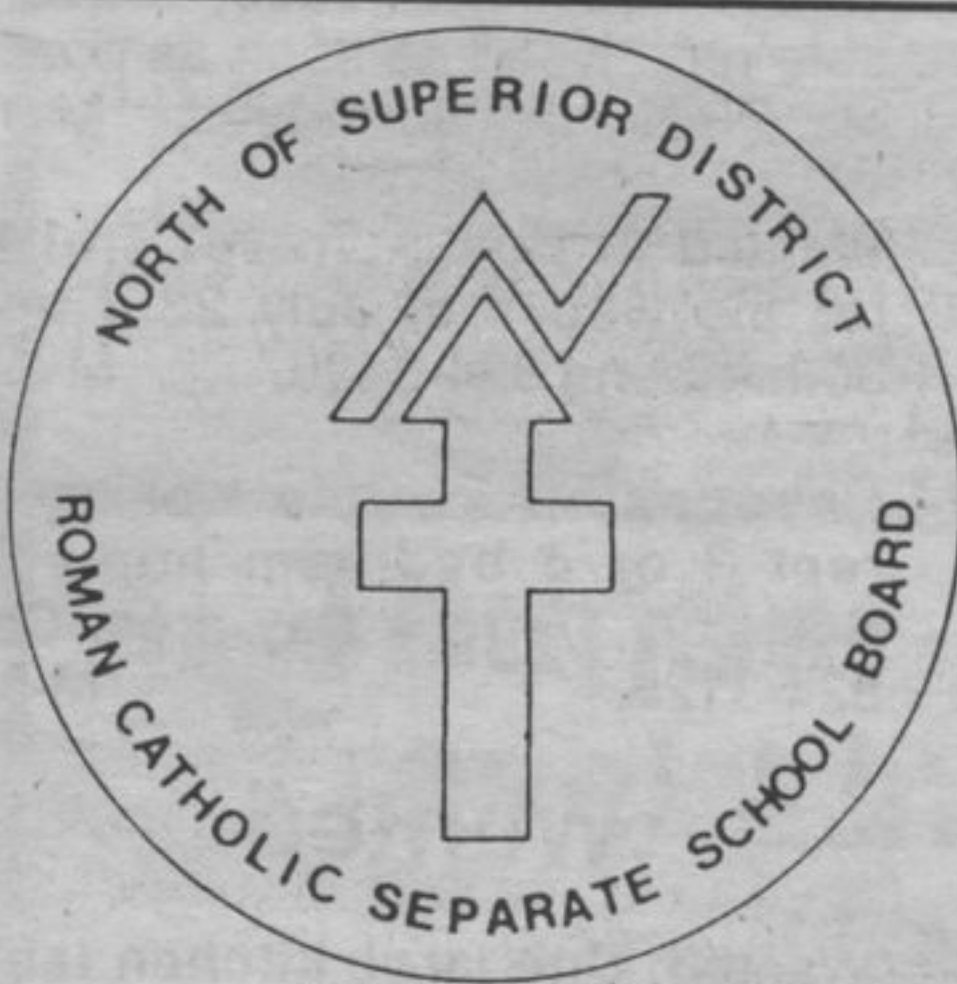
reminder

Under Provincial Statute - a building permit is required for any building construction, alteration or demolition. Structures smaller than 10 square metres do not require building permits, but must comply with zoning by-laws.

NOTE THAT PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR:

- porches/decks/steps
- installation of wood stoves, furnaces, etc.
- chimney construction/modification
- garage/sheds
- structural alterations
- additions
