NOTICE OF INTENT TO PASS AN AMMENDING BY-LAW TO BY-LAW 88-24, THE EFFECT OF WHICH IS TO CHANGE CERTAIN LOTS FROM RESIDENTIAL ZONE (R1) TO RESIDENTIAL MULTIPLE ZONE (R2)

TAKE NOTICE: That the Council of the Township of Schreiber intends to By-Law 89-6 on the 28th day of June 1989, under Section 34 of the Planning Act 1983 as amended.

AND TAKE FURTHER NOTICE: That a Public Meeting, will be held on June 21, 1989 at 7:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, to consider a change in zoning of Lots 6 and 7 of Plan M115, 323 Newman Street, from R1 Residential Zone, to R2 Residential Multiple Zone. The zoning change will allow the construction of an additional apartment on lot 6, and the construction of a second 3 unit apartment on lot 7.

Also to be considered is a change in zoning of Lots 29 and 30 Plan 55M-477, 615 Peary Street, from R1 Residential to R2 Residential Multiple. The zoning change will allow the creation of additional units in the existing duplex, to a maximum of 2 units per lot.

ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting, and/or make written, or verbal representation in support of, or in opposition to the proposed zoning by-law amendment.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION relating to the proposed zoning by-law amendment is available for inspection, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., at the Municipal Office, 608 Winnipeg Street, Schreiber.
