It's evening and your pet is not home, what can you do? If it's a dog, he shouldn't be loose in the first place, unless it was an accident.

If it's a cat, they usually can find their way home, unless they are hurt or there is a snow storm and it has affected their sense of direction.

When you discover your pet is gone there are many things that you can do.

First, check your own area, look under the porches in your yard and the neighbor's yards. If it's a cat check under car hoods and in wheel wells, these are favorite hiding places of cats that are frightened or lost.

Leave scented articles in an ever widening circle in a one mile area, this will help your dog get a perspective of his home area.

Call police - it's surprising

how many people report finding dogs to the police.

Call your local dog catcher or town hall to see if anyone has reported finding a lost pet.

Call public works offices, they may be able to tell you if a dog or cat has been killed on the roads.

Call you local radio station. Call local schools and ask if they can announce over the PA system the missing dog's description.

If it's a purebred dog, contact the Canadian Kennel Club in Toronto, they now keep missing/found dog files. Have your dog's tattoo number available to give with the dog's description.

Put up posters at Post Offices, grocery stores, movie theaters and other public places.

Place an ad in local papers, and call all local veterinarians to report the missing pct.

Call Humane Societies and any other animal rescue associations in your area and surrounding localities.

Most importantly, do everything you can to prevent your pet from being lost.

The fundraising was to raise money for the Muscular Dystrophy Association all along the North Shore.


Teniuk said the pledges and donations haven't been added up yet but that they should have a total in a few weeks.
