## Being a perfect volunteer leader

How do you recognize the perfect volunteer? What does it take to be a great leader?

If you're Bart Mindszenthy, vicepresident with the Beloff Group, you develop a quality checklist based (more or less accurately) on the acronyms.

According to the Mindszenthy system of definitions, a "perfict" V-O-L-U-N-T-E-E-R meets the following criteria:

V - values the organization

O - organizes well (the job, responsibility, assignment) L - likes his/her role

U - understands the needs of the organi-

zation and his/her responsibilities

N - never a pushover T - trusts the organization and its leader-

E - experiments

E - enlists - supports, volunteers R - reviews (ie, can pause and reflect on the objectives, that fit with the organization, successes and failures).

The "P-E-R-F-I-C-T" leader, on the other hand, has a role in setting an example for volunteers (even if perfect spelling is not one of them):

P - Purpose: a good leader gives purpose to the organization and is clear and consistent in communi-

cating goals and the group's mission. E - Example: a good leader is a role model, spreads rather than hoards responsibility, is accountable and

helps others learn. R - Rewards: a good leader shares the glory and recognizes the contribu-

tion of others. F - Focus: a good leader articulates why he or she is there in a way that

others understand. Inspiration: a good leader must be willing to roll up their shirt sleeves and dig into even the dirtiest job; in so doing, encourages people to reach deeper and further inside them-

C - Consistent: a good leader behaves as a leader should behave, and doesn't send mixed messages to those around them.

Tough: a good leader has to be a "tough-loving" manager who expects volunteers to perform as if they were paid for the work they do.
