Converting your cat Back a Fighter

Love and patience is the key to converting an outdoor cat to an indoor cat.

Having a cat indoors definitely prevents disease and injury. It is also easier to keep the cat clean and free from parasites and fleas.

Once you have decided to convert your cat there is now turning back. The animal must be kept indoors at all times.

Your cat will become very vocal and complain to you, but you must be firm.

First, take a small amount of dirt to mix with the cat litter until the cat gets used to the litter. Confine the cat to a room with the litter box at night.

Buy or make a scratching post with a hanging toy on it.


Buy catnip toys to keep the cat amused.
