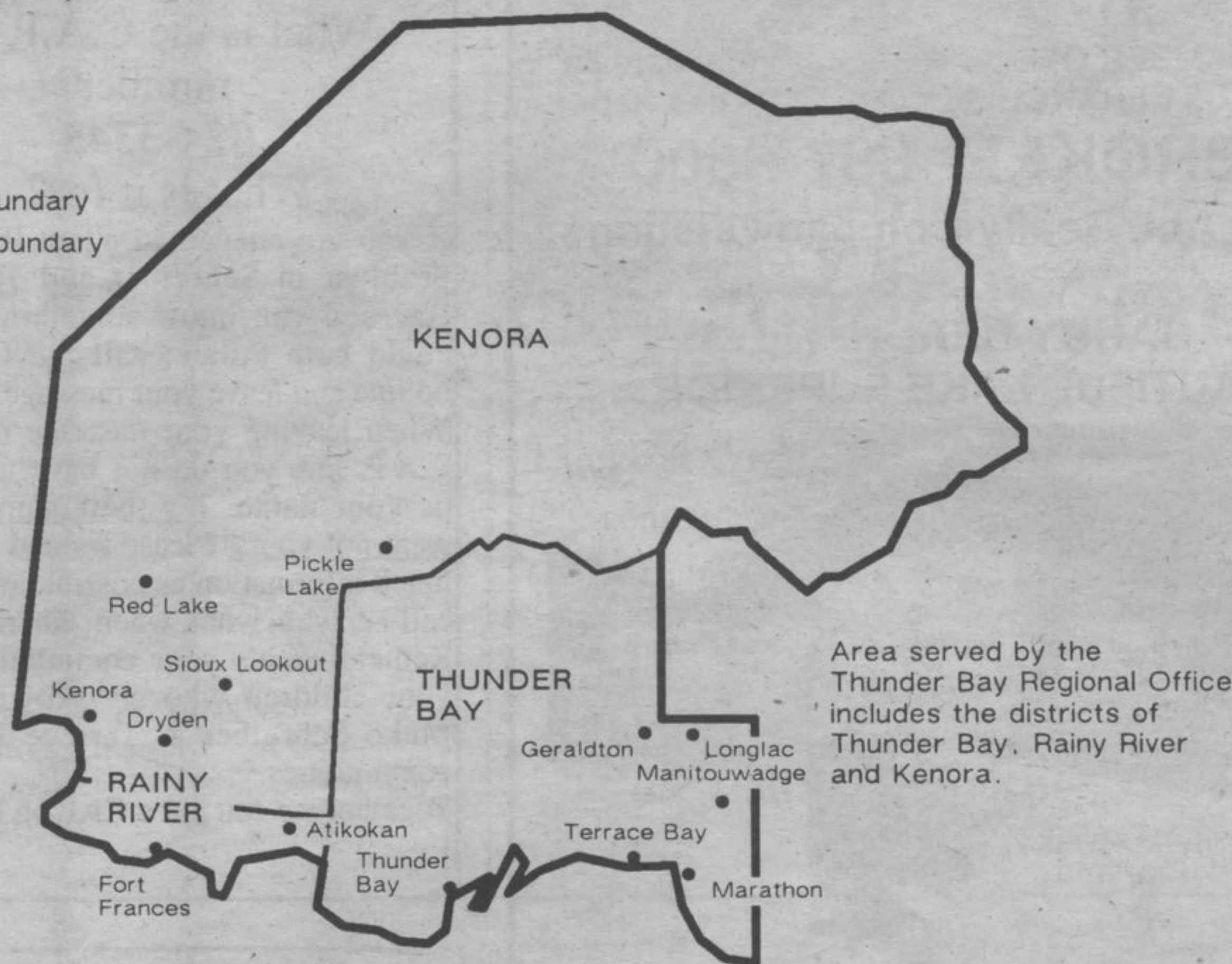
REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS
