greener on my neighbor's side of the fence. He says I should water weekly in the morning; I say every afternoon. Who's right?

Dear Proverbial Pat: He's right-about an inch of water each week keeps a lawn at its peak. And water early in the day. He who hesitates is lost, since water droplets can evaporate in the heat of the mid-day sun before reaching grass roots.

When it comes to a healthy lawn, spare the water, spoil the lawn. Light sprinklings can increase the chance of disease and drought damage. A good inch of water can soak 6 to 8 inches into the ground, encouraging a deep, stong root system. Give it an inch, it'll grow a mile:

Here's a tip to figure out how long it takes to water an inch: mark plastic containers or tin cans an inch from the bottom and place them around the sprinkler's watering zone. Then clock the time it takes the water to reach the one-inch mark. You can also use a rain gauge to measure the amount of rainwater your lawn gets, so you can add what Mother Nature doesn't supply.

Dear John: Is it okay to stop my mower to add gasoline and start it right up again?

Dear Fueled-up: Never remove

Dear John: The grass is always the gas cap or add gasoline to your mower when the engine is running or hot. The best time to fill the tank is before you've begun mowing and the engine is cool. Always add fuel outdoors. And, leave your smoking materials inside so you can't light up absentmindedly.

Wipe up spills and move the mower away from the spill before starting it. Let the engine cool before storing equipment, and store both mowers and gasoline containers away from sparks or open flames.

Dear John: What is the purpose of mulching and how is it done?

Dear Mulching Mel: Gardeners mulch for two main reasons: to reduce weeding chores, and to help soil retain moisture for their crops. Mulches keep weed seeds dormant by preventing light and air from getting through to the soil.

Mulches also maintain soil temperature and conserve moisture to benefit plants. Mulches are also effective in keeping lowlying crops, like cucumbers and squash, from coming into contact with the soil and rotting.

Mulches can be made of organic materials such as leaves or straw, or synthetic black plastic sheeting. Be sure the soil has plenty of moisture before laying the black plastic mulch.

The students were sponsored in part by Abitibi Price Provincial Paper Mill, which paid the airfare to Finland.


The students started work in Finland on June 1 and will complete their work term August 31.


