

A&W asking customers for reaction

(Vancouver) - A & W Food Services of Canada Ltd., has launched a Canada-wide, in-store campaign to ask its customers how they feel about the proposed federal goods and services tax as it relates to food service.

Beginning this week, A & W customers will be invited to indicate "Yes" or "No" to the following question on a ballot: "Is it fair that food purchased in supermarkets and food stores is tax free while food sold in fast food restaurants, office cafeterias, table service restaurants and snack bars

is taxed at an additional 9 per cent?"

"What we're seeking is the

honest reaction of our customers to the proposed tax," said A & W President Ross Cunningham. "We're asking people to indi-

cate whether they're for or against a practice that will put food, based on where it is sold, on a different tax footing."

Cunningham notes foodservice sales will fall by 5 to 7.5 per cent in 1991 should a 9 per cent GST be put into effect as currently proposed.

The Canadian Restaurant and Foodservices Association notes that the foodservice industry is labor intensive, highly competitive and marginally profitable and that a decline in sales will result in an increase in business failures and unemployment among the industry's 72,000 businesses and 600,000 employees.

Local A & W restaurants will be running the ballot survey until October 22 and will then tally the ballots and deliver them to their local MPs.


