as sports and recreation, arts and culture, hospitals, and province-wide charities.

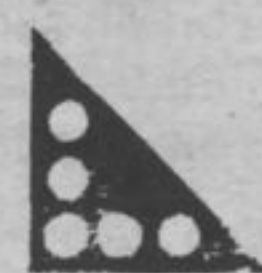
