Ears are sensitive part of your pet

Have you ever had an ear ache? If you have then you will remember the intense pain. If you haven't, then picture a toothache in your ear and you will know what the pain is like.

Your pet is highly susceptible to getting ear problems if you do not take precautions.

Check for redness, discharge or foreign matter in the ear canals. If your pet tilts his head, shakes his head excessively or constantly rubs his face on the floor or couch, then he may have an ear problem.

Ear infections may occur because of ear mites, bacteria and fungus.

If you see any of these symptoms call your vet. Your pet may need to see the vet for an ear suction and cleaning.

Don't feed or give him water, he may have to have a mild anesthetic to make the removal of substances more comfortable.

Never try to remove anything from the inside of your dog or cat's ear.

Dogs with long droopy ears such as spaniels and setters, are particularly susceptible to infection. Their large ears prevent air from drying their ear canals.

Preventive care will reduce problems. Every few weeks, check each of your pet's ears for wax or dirt build up.

Gently remove any accumulation with a cotton pad moistened with hydrogen peroxide. Ear cleaning solutions are available from your vet but check with your vet before applying any product inside the ear canals of your pet.
