McCausland's emergency department always ready

McCausland's Emergency Department doesn't keep patients waiting for hours like most hospitals in larger cities, yet it treats anywhere from 300 to 500 patients every month.

Fractures and cuts are the most common type of injury treated at the emergency department although doctors do perform work such as changing dressings and removing lumps, cysts and lesions in the department as well.


Aldea Churney has been head of the emergency department since it was first created in 1980. Her title of emergency and operating room supervising nurse means she oversees much of the work that takes place in the emergency department as well as the operating room.

Churney works the day shift at McCausland's emergency department but while she is not at work, two registered nurses and one registered nurses assistant work the floor of the hospital and also take care of the emergency department.

Churney said one doctor is on call at all times to cover emergencics and added that if it's a real emergency and the doctor on call is in Schreiber, she won't hesitate to call one of the doctors in Terrace Bay to come in to handle the situation.

If there are a number of patients waiting to be treated, Churney uses her experience to handle the emergency and to decide which injury is to be treated first.

While area residents are the main users of the emergency department, Churney said people travelling through the area often use the department to receive treatment for things such as allergies and chest pain.

Churney said she was pleased with pamphlets the hospital distributed recently outlining some of the aspects of the emergency department.

She also said its better for somebody to come in to the emergency department to be examined

if they are experiencing chest pains or any other health related problems, than to think the problem will go away on its own.

Even if your injury is not lifethreatening, the emergency room staff are always on hand to treat your injury or condition.
