CONCERNING A PROPOSED ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Terrace Bay will hold a Public Meeting on Monday, December 11, 1989, at 6:30 p.m. at the Terrace Bay Municipal Office, 12 Simcoe Plaza, to consider a proposed zoning By-Law Amendment under Section 34 of the Planning Act.


The proposed zoning By-Law Amendment would change the zoning category of approximately 5.55 hectares of land from "MX" (Extractive Industrial) to "MD" (Disposal Industrial) to permit the construction of drying beds for treated sewage sludge.
