drivers have been told to pull into the location in such a way that they will not interfere with the fire trucks. LaBarge added if there is a fire call, the bus driver will be present at all times and can move the bus to accommodate the fire department.

LaBarge said the main reason for the move was because the prior location on the Mill Road was a poor one, was difficult for people to get to and did not have good operating hours.

"We cater to people without cars and although the other agent was good, the location was poor. We'd like to thank him (Steve Barry) for the time he was our agent," said Horn.

LaBarge said, "what you have to look at is what's better for the people. We have to have a valid reason for changing locations. This (J.C.T.) is a central location and has excellent hours."

The Terrace Bay stop will not

be an extended one - just long enough to drop off and pick up passengers and parcels.

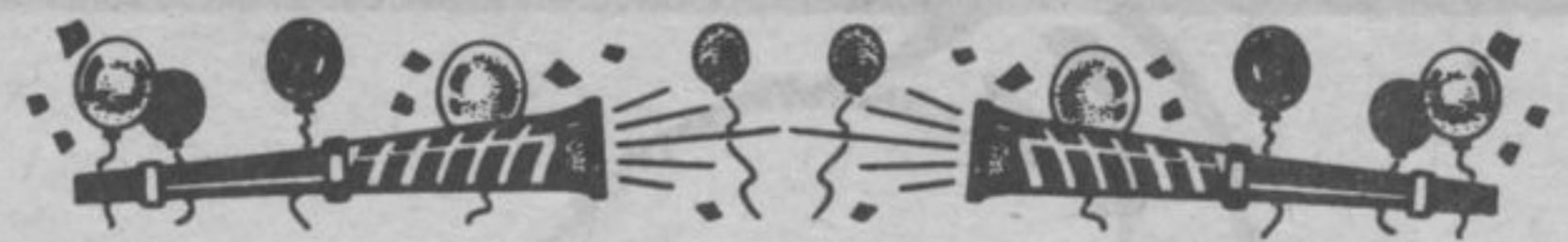
LaBarge said Greyhound wanted to make the move before Christmas because it will better serve the larger number of seasonal travellers and also make it easier for people who are picking up and delivering parcels.

J.C.T. will also be offering the service of picking up parcels to be put on the bus and delivering parcels which come in on the bus.

The busses will leave J.C.T. going west at 1:05 a.m., 5:55 a.m., 10:35 a.m. and 7:20 p.m.

Busses heading east will leave at 1:05 a.m., 9:15 a.m., 2:05 p.m. and 10:35 p.m.
