Commercial fishing in Ontario

The Ministry of Natural Resources will conduct an indepth policy review to determine how Ontario's commercial fisheries will be managed into the 21st century.

Natural Resources Minister Lyn McLeod has appointed her parliamentary assistant, Jack Riddell, to solicit opinions and comments on commercial fisheries management from a wide range of interest groups.

"We're looking at the way commercial fisheries are managed in response to concerns raised by fish producers, anglers, environmental groups, local com-


munities and others," Mrs. McLeod said. I'm confident that through consultation with these groups, Mr. Riddell will formulate policy directions that will ensure the continued long-term health of our fisheries and the many benefits they provide."

Mr. Riddell announced the terms of the review today at the annual convention of the Ontario Fish Producers Association (OFPA). Over the next three months, he plans to meet with interest groups such as the OFPA, the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters and the Federation of Ontario Naturalists, as well as

local fish and game clubs and chambers of commerce. He will then compile recommendations based on his findings and deliver them to the Minister by late spring.

"Commercial fishing is important to Ontario," Mr. Riddell said. "I look forward to helping develop a policy that continues to support the industry, other users and the health of the fisheries into the 1990s and beyond."


Among the major issues to be discussed during the review are the method for allocating harvest levels among sport and commercial fishermen; imposing royalties on commercial catches; and dealing with the commercial harvest of non-targeted species.
