A service of the library is microfiche of the Thunder Bay and Tri-Regional catalogues for access to titles not held by our library.


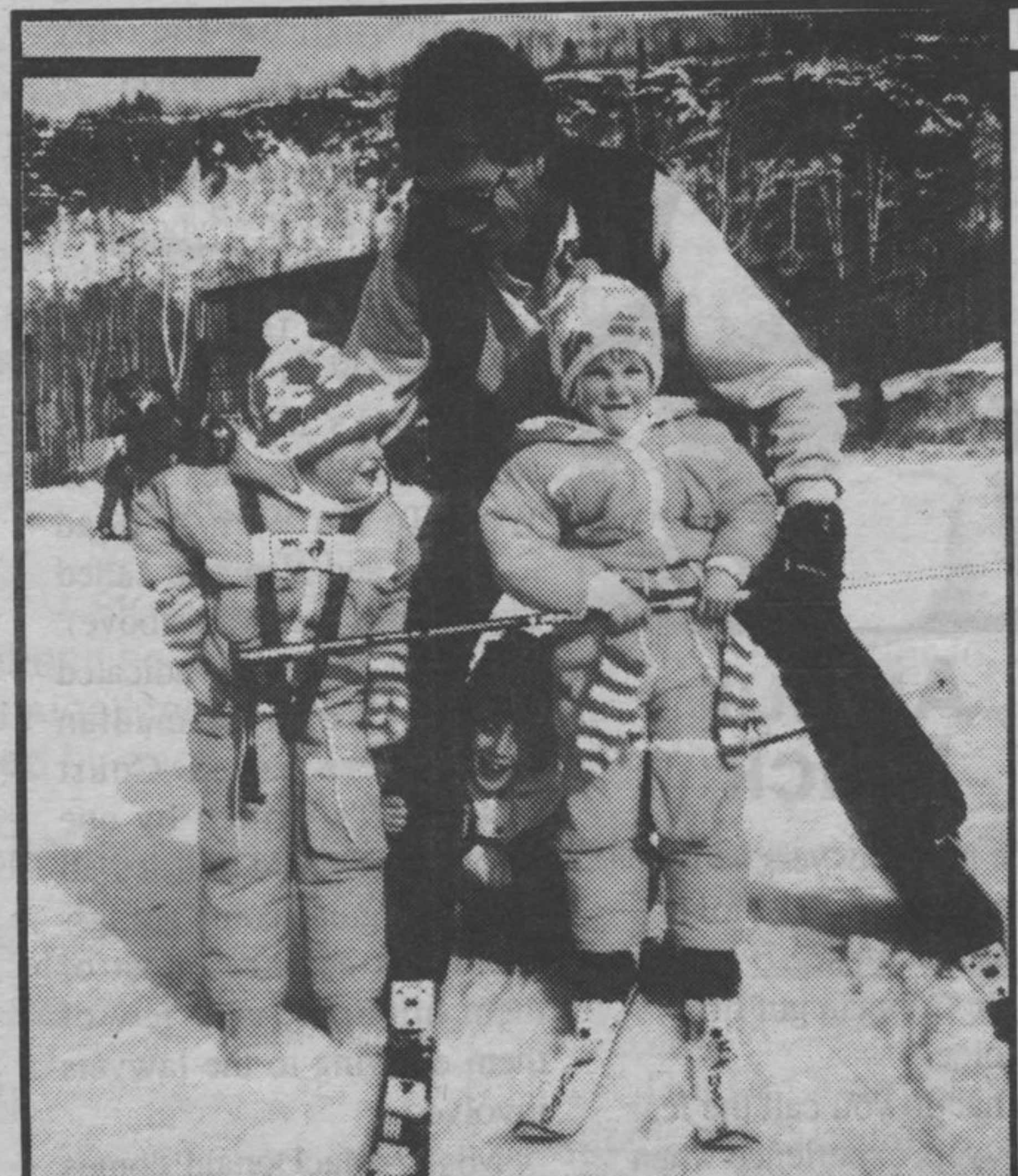
