Take responsibility for newborn kittens

Before I start the lesson for "sit, stay" I'd like to talk about the latest arrival at our home. We now have a 2 week old kitten in

our care.

From what I can gather, by way of the neighborhood children, this kitten has passed along through many households.

Anyone who has one of these kittens should feed them with an eye dropper, syringe, or premature baby bottle.

They have not been weaned and do not have the ability to relieve themselves. This can be done by you. All you need to do is gently rub a warm, moist face

cloth around the anus three or four times a day.

After four weeks, the kittens should be able to care for themselves.

Enfalac is a better supplement feeding formula than regular milk. Make 3 oz. of formula at a time, warm the milk before feeding.

This is an example of what happens when animals are not spayed or neutered.

These kittens should never have been born. If you have the

responsibility for a litter of kittens wait at least until they are 5 to 6 weeks before placing them in a home. A pregnant cat is your responsibility, not your neighbors.

Teaching your dog to sit is usually the easiest lesson. Place your right hand in back of the collar and use your left hand to tuck the back legs down. Action must accompany the word "sit."

For the first week stay beside your dog. Your dog should be worked in your left side. Once he has comprehended the command

"sit", then "stay" can be brought into the command.

Three signals are used: voice, hand, and right foot.

Hand in front of the dog's muzzle, step off on the right foot accompanied by command "stay."
Turn and face your dog. Your left hand should be palm up with the lead in it.

Only keep your dog in a sit, stay for 10 seconds, then return to your dog. Use a release word such as "OK". This will let the dog know it is all right to move. Always use the same command words.
