# Pet Talk- Teaching your puppy to retrieve

Our playing with a ball or toy is now being directed to another form of control. What has been a game is now becoming an exercise. As with all exercises in KPT it is important to have the puppy thoroughly enjoying what he is doing.

Keep up the game, but start using the same words (com-

mands) for each portion of the retrieving.

Throw the ball or toy, and as the pup goes for it, apply the word you wish to use when you want him to pick it up - "Fetch", "Get it", "Take it", whatever you feel the most comfortable using. As the pup starts to put his mouth on it, use the same happy praise you were using in the game, but

as you have the pup on a lead, you will give a little "pop" on the collar just to encourage him to come back to you (keep the lead short until the pup is used to turning and coming back to you). Use a lot of praise, then make him give it up with the word of your choice, "Out", "Give", "Thank you".


Remember that whenever you play with your pup and whatever your game, you (establish your leadership) must be the eventual

winner.

Keep the right attitude, use your voice, to the best advantage and watch your pup carefully, so that you will be using the proper timing.

Above all, keep this lesson particularly short - stop when the puppy still wants to retrieve so continued on page 7
