On the 18th of October 1989 a man was shot from behind with a 12 gauge shot gun. The man, Onesime Cloutier, received injuries to the lower right shoulder and arm.

In the early morning hours of 19 October 1989 the O.P.P. arrested David Dittburner of Whitesand Lake. He was charged with Attempt Murder. The O.P.P. also found a marijuana plantation in one of his sheds with approximately 70 plants growing. Police charged hem with Cultivation of a Narcotic.

Dittburner appeared in a Thunder Bay Court on 20 April 1990 and pled guilty to Causing Bodily Harm with Intent. He was given a \$1,000 fine, placed on probation for three years and Prohibited from Owning a Firearm or Ammunition for three years.

Dittburner also pled guilty to a Cultivation of a Narcotic charge and received a \$1,000 fine.

Dittburner pled guilty to an Impaired Driving charge and received 14 days in jail and two years prohibition from Driving.


Consumer and Corporate Affairs warned consumers to stop using direct-vent natural gas and propane fireplaces because of the danger of explosion. Three persons have been reported injured in Ontario since the fireplaces were introduced two years ago. The majority of sales have taken place in Ontario and British Columbia.

The warning applies to fireplaces that exhaust directly through the wall behind the unit and that have a sealed glass front panel that cannot be opened.

Under certain conditions, the burner flame may die, resulting in an accumulation of gas inside the unit. Attempts to reignite the flame may cause an explosion, shattering the front glass and sending particles into the room.

The Canadian Gas Association has rescinded certification of all brands of gas fireplaces. Sales of new units have been suspended until the necessary safety modifications have been made.
