Anglers reminded of fishing regulations

Now that the open water fishing season is upon us, anglers in the North Central Region, which extends from Atikokan to White Lake are reminded of the new sport fishing regulations which were recently passed into laws. Implementation of regulation

changes makes it critical that anglers get a copy of the "Ontario Summary of Fishing Regulations" when picking up their sport fishing licenses. Summaries are available from most sporting goods stores and at all MNR District Offices.

"These regulations were passed in order to sustain Northern Ontario's quality sport fisheries", said Bob Thompson, Regional Biologist for the North Central Region. "Concern for the fisheries prompted regulation amendments, and biological studies identified problem areas, which were discussed with the public during the Fisheries Management Planning process."

All District Fisheries Management Plans in the Region have been approved (for the administrative districts of Atikokan, Geraldton, Nipigon, Terrace Bay, and Thunder Bay). Examples of regulation changes are a Province-wide aggregate limit of 5 trout or salmon per day, which now includes brook trout in the total. there must not be

more than 3 lake trout in this total, and for Lake Superior, not more than 3 lake trout or brook trout. The catch limit of 2 brook trout on Albany River is now in place for Lake Nipigon and the Nipigon River System. New maximum size limits are in effect for walleye in the Atikokan District and for pike in the Geraldton District. Trout size limits also apply to certain water bodies in Geraldton and Nipigon Districts.

Queen to visit

Secretary of State Gerry Weiner announced today details for the visit to Canada of Her Majesty The Queen.

Her Majesty will arrive in Calgary on June 27 and will be greeted at an official arrival ceremony at the Olympic Plaza.

The highlights of Her Majesty's visit to Alberta will be a visit to Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre, attendance at the Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Spruce Meadows Equestrian Centre, the opening of the Museum of the Regiments, and the review of the King's Own Calgary Regiments and The Calgary Highlanders. Her Majesty, as Colonel-in-Chief, will present a new Queen's Color to The Calgary Highlanders at McMahon Stadium.

Her Majesty will then fly to Ottawa and take part in the Canada Day celebrations in the National Capital Region. She will attend a reception hosted by the Governor General during the afternoon.

Her Majesty will return to the United Kingdom in the evening of July 1.

TOWNSHIP OF SCHREIBER THE EXPROPRIATION ACT R.S.O. CHAPTER 148



In the matter of an application by the Corporation of the Township of Schreiber for approval to expropriate land, being more particularly described in Schedule "A" detailed below, in the Township of Schreiber, in the District of Thunder Bay, for the purpose of widening a municipal road and related facilities.

Notice is hereby given that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in Schedule "A" below. A plan showing such lands may be seen at the Township Office, 608 Winnipeg Street, Schreiber, Ontario.

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority, shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

(a) In the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice or, when he is served by publication within thirty days after the first notice of publication of the notice:

(b) In the case of an owner who is not a registered owner within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act, RSO 1980, Chapter 148 Provides that,

(a) Where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General.

(b) The inquiry officer,

i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his Counsel or agent man.
ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

2. "Owner" and "Registered Owner" are defined in the act as follows: "Owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested: "registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the property registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll;

3. The expropriating authority, each owner, who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry. This Notice first published on the first day of May, 1990.
