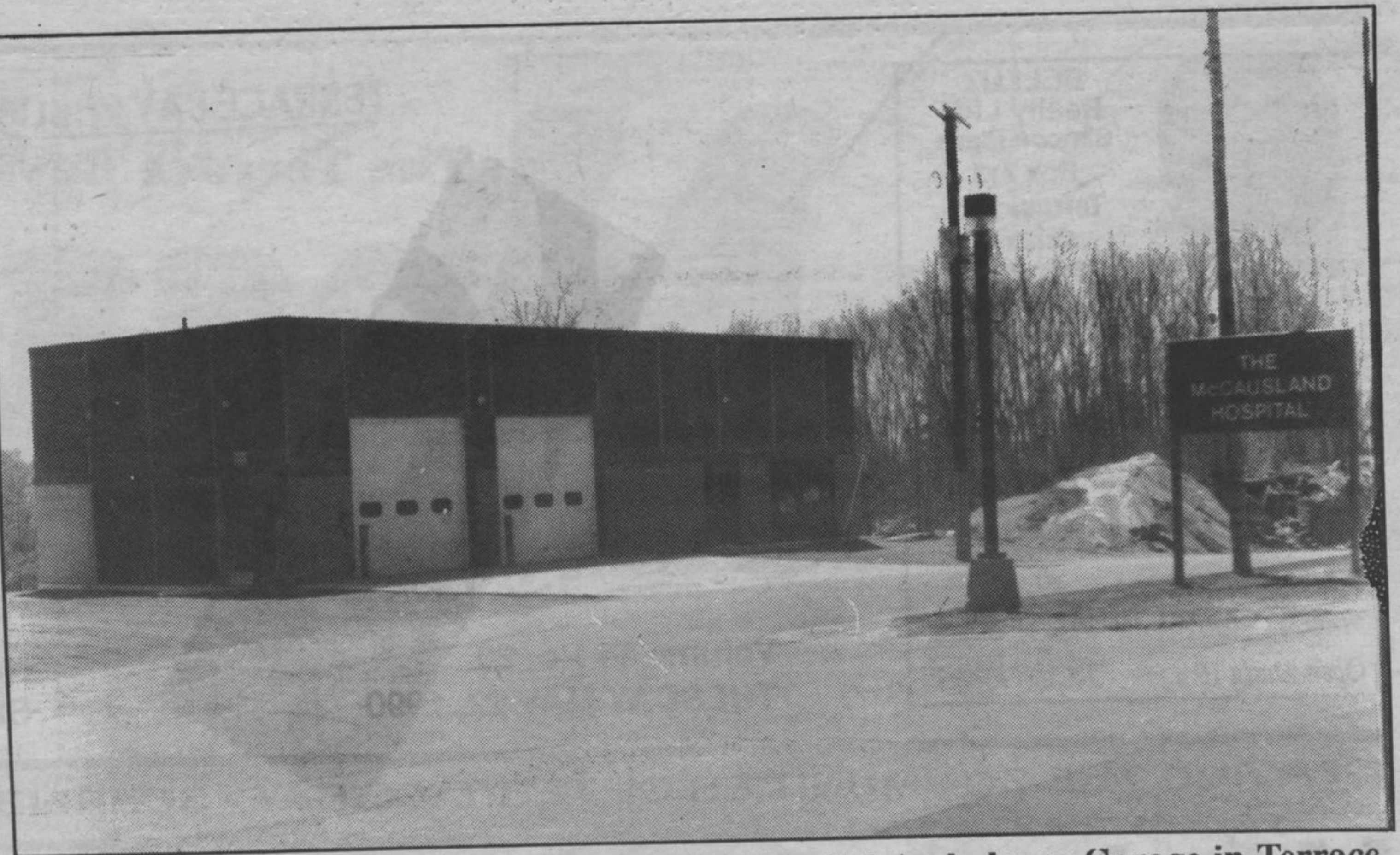

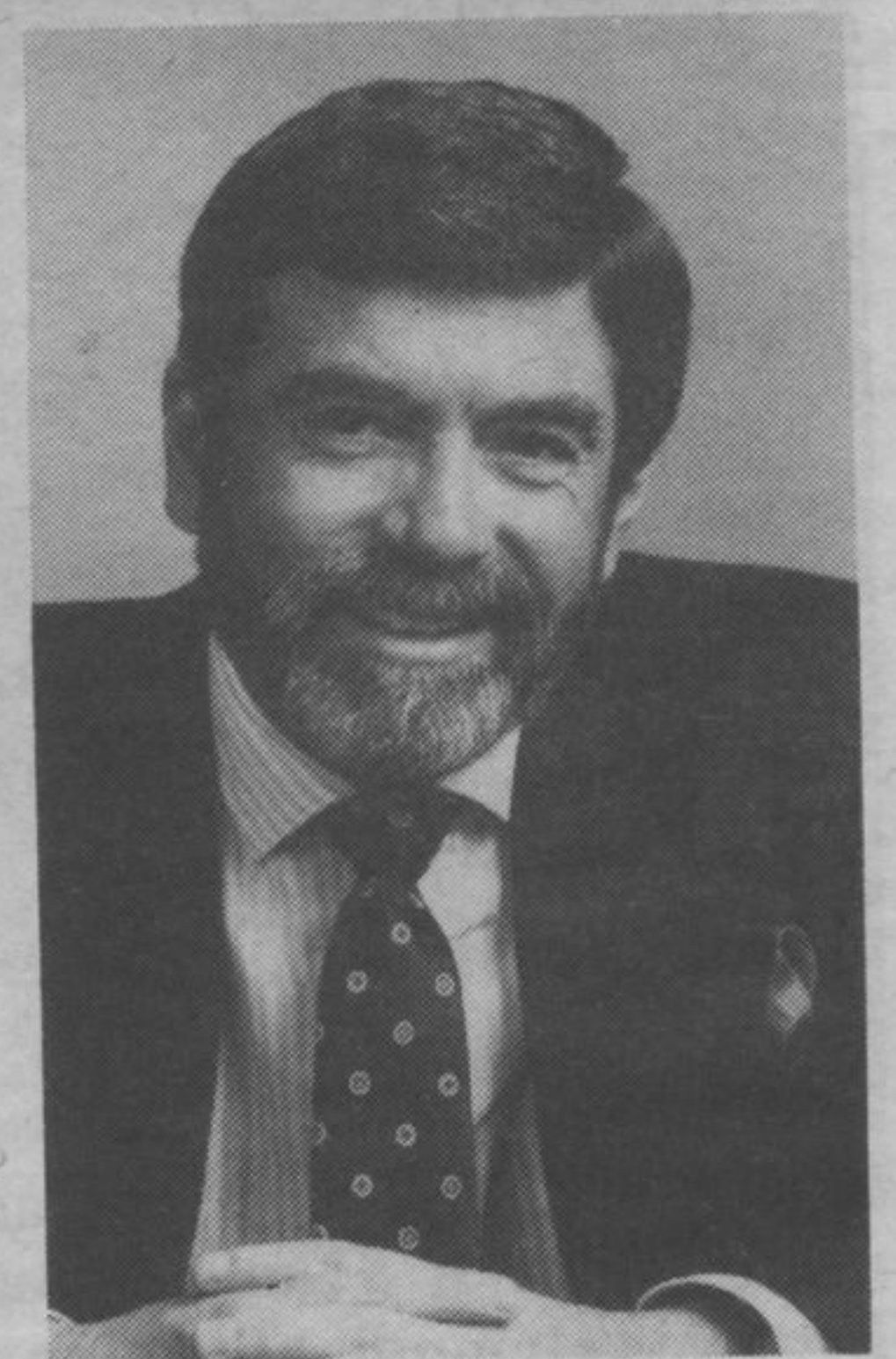
ness in markets throughout the U.S. and Canada.

- choisir de voter uniquement pour les membres de la section de langue française du conseil, à l'exclusion des autres membres du conseil, 1986, chap. 29, art. 11, en partie.

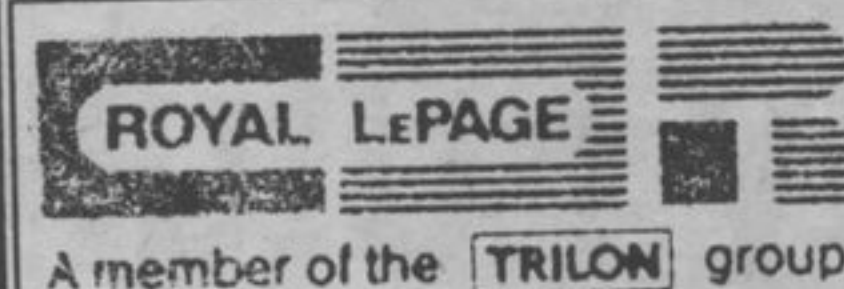
