and end around August 17th.

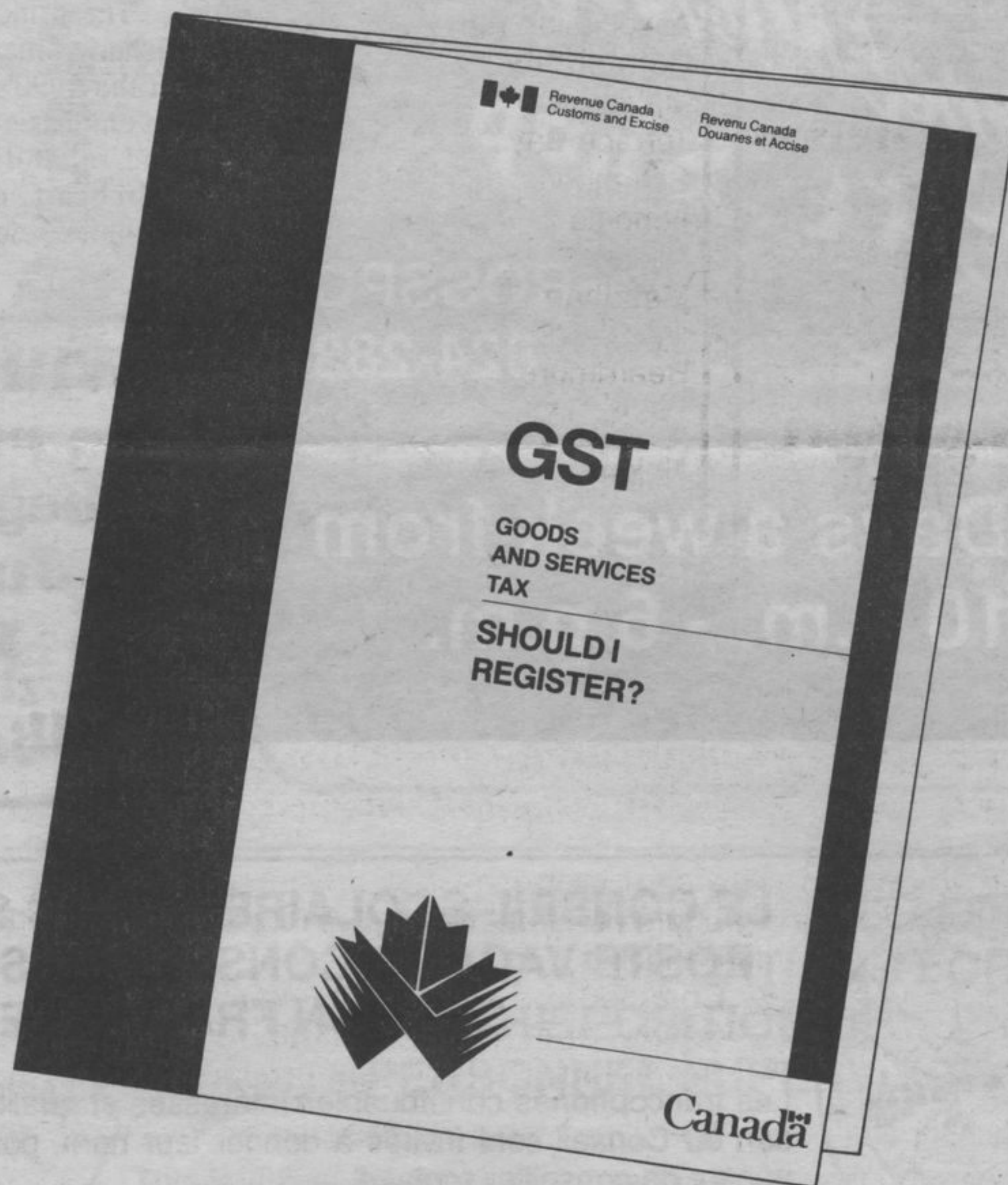
