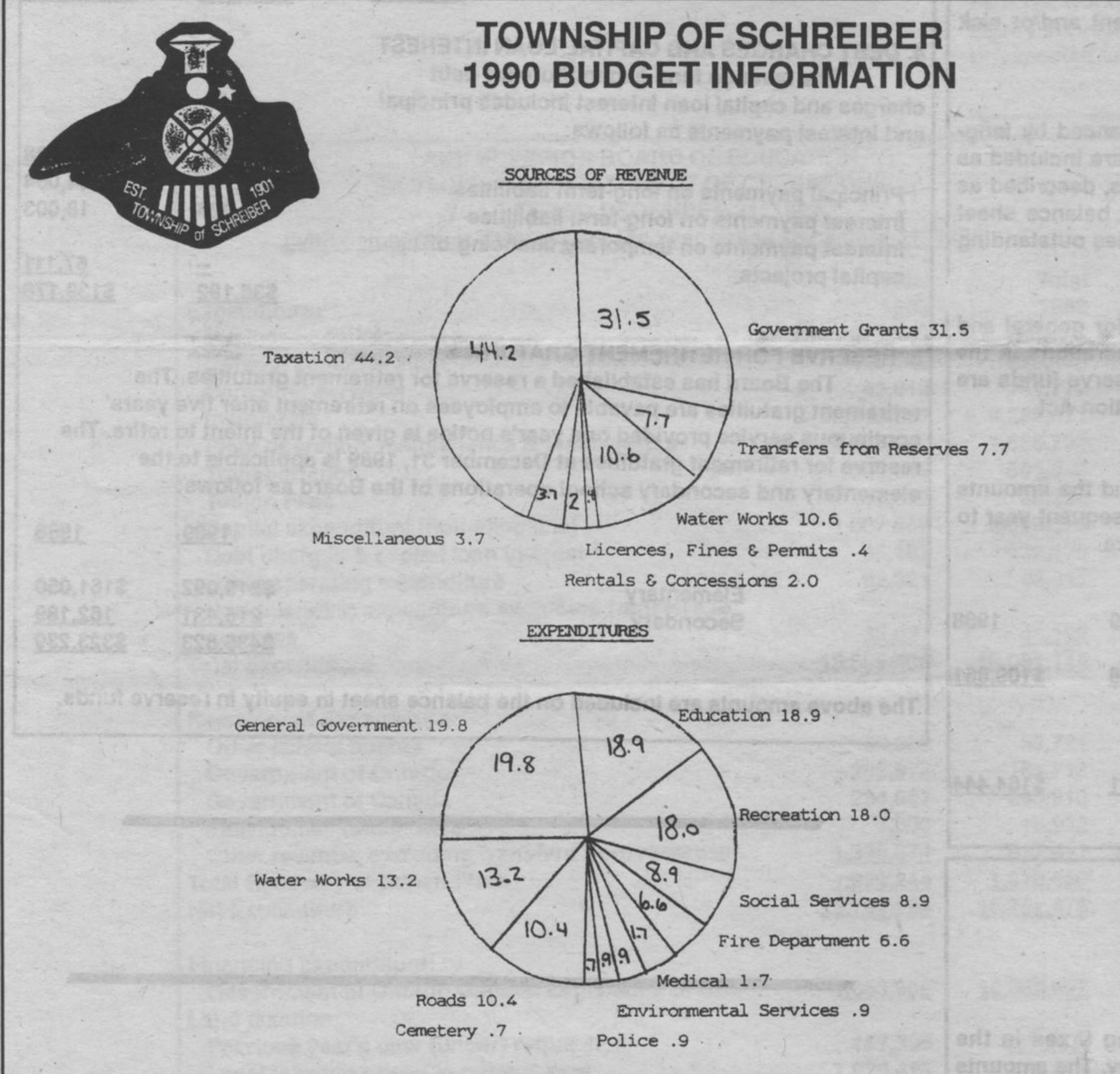

The 1990 Municipal mill rate is 207.500 up 9.704 mills from 1989 which is a 4.907% mill rate increase. This amounts to an increase of \$31.30 on a house with a market value of \$58,000. The 1990 School mill rates for the Elementary & Secondary panels is 165.579 mills, up 23.073 mills from 1989. The Public and Separate mill rates differ only marginally. The mill rate increase is 16.191%, an increase of \$74.41, on a house valued at \$58,000. The General Municipal rate increase, reflects the current inflationary trend, even though the Provincial General Support Grants remain fixed at their 1989 level. The dollar values of various sources of revenue, and expenditures are listed below.
