The proposed zoning by-law amendment would add "professional office" as a permitted use in Birchwood Terrace, Thunder Bay District Homes for the Aged.


ANY PERSON may attend the Public Meeting and/or written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition the the proposed zoning by-law amendment.


