District has new council for unions

A district council of unions has been formed for the North Shore.

The Marathon and District Council of Unions will be the forerunner of a Labour Council for an area running from Schreiber to White River, said Len Nelson, Canadian Labour Council regional representative.

"A labour council is the organized voice of all the unions in a given region," Nelson explained.

"We have an interim executive in place until we affiliate all of the unions in the area," he said.

Nelson added that formal elections will be held in April.

The interim executive was established at a meeting of 15 delegates from 12 organizations on Oct.29, in Terrace Bay.

Nelson estimates a potential membership of 2,500 from CLC affiliated local unions.

"The membership is only open to CLC affiliates," he said.

The interim executive for the Marathon and North Shore District Council of Labour is: President - Don Lavigne, UPIU, Local 665; Vice-president - Bill Robinson, USWA; Secretary -Tom Murray, UPIU; Treasurer -Betty Stuttard, CPPA; Sargeant-at Arms - Charlie Moore, CUPE.

Regular monthly meetings will be held in Marathon and Terrace Bay.


The next meeting is Wednesday, Dec.5, 7p.m. in Marathon.
