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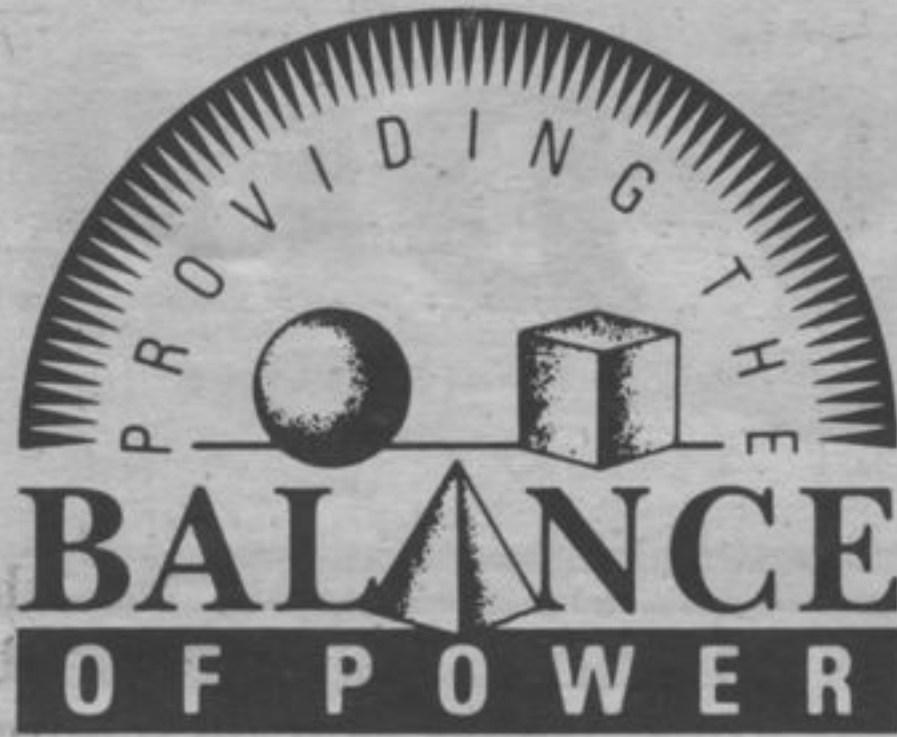
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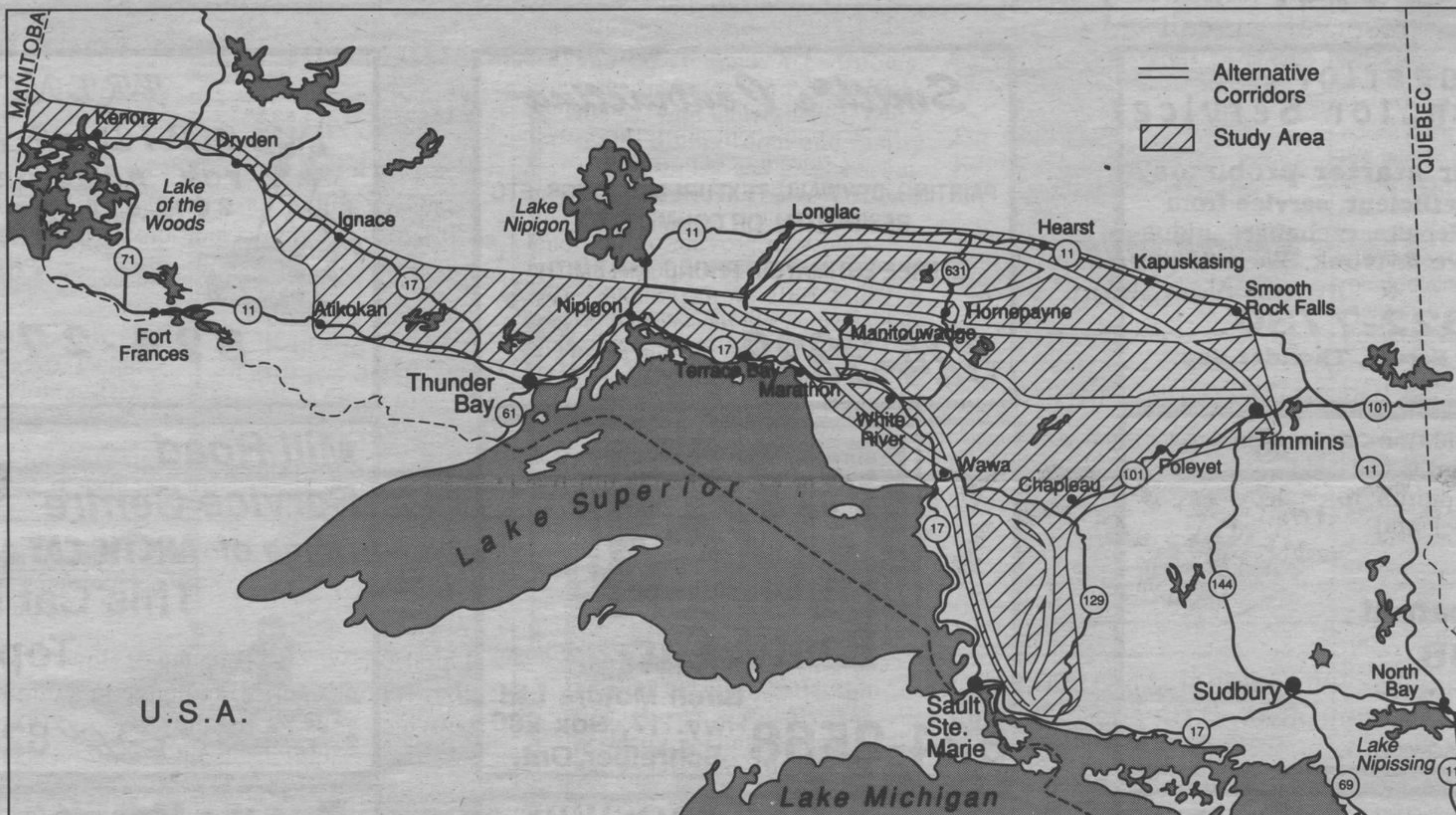


# Study Announcement

Ontario Hydro is starting Environmental Assessment (EA) Studies to identify a route for a new 500,000 volt transmission line from the Manitoba

border to either the Timmins or Sault St. Marie areas. The line is required to allow Ontario Hydro to accept delivery of 1000 megawatts of

power annually from Manitoba Hydro beginning in the year 2000, as specified in a contract signed between the two utilities last year.



The line is part of Ontario Hydro's Demand/Supply Plan to meet the province's electricity needs over the next 25 years. The focus of the Plan is to balance electricity resources with growing customer needs.

The rationale and requirement for a line to incorporate this purchase is subject to approval by the Environmental Assessment Board reviewing Hydro's Demand/Supply Plan. The Plan also includes measures to reduce growth in demand by helping people use electricity more efficiently,

purchasing electricity from independent power producers, rehabilitating existing generating stations and constructing new ones.

The need for all the facilities and measures identified in the Demand/Supply Plan is the subject of public review, which began with a preliminary hearing under the Environmental Assessment Act in April, 1990. The selection of a route for the new line and sites for new transformer stations, required at strategic points along the route, is subject to a separate EA approval.
