

Rating: 1 poor.....10 excellent

This wonderful film, based on Sir James M. Barrie's play, is finally out on video. Now all parents, grandparents and other assorted adults can share all the wonder and spirit of adventure with their favourite little ones.

This movie is a Disney classic that has been around for a long time. There may, however, still be some people out there who don't know what it is all about. Let me begin by saying one of the main characters is Peter Pan; a fun-loving, game-playing, adventure-seeking boy. He is the leader of a group called The Lost Boys. They all live in Neverland, an enchanted paradise where no one ever grows up.

The Lost Boys want a mother to read them bedtime stories so Peter searches for just the right person. He finds it in Mary one of the few people who believes completely in Peter Pan. She knows in her heart that he is a real boy and not just " a bunch of silly poppycock " as her father says. With a little help from Pixie dust, Peter shows Mary and her two brothers, John and Micheal, how to fly.

The 3 children join Peter on one adventure after another. They hunt for wild animals, visit mermaids, fight pirates, rescue an Indian princess, become honorary braves, and fight some more pirates. (Just as we all did when we were children.)

Hydro rebates on block heaters

Ontario Hydro will be provide rebates on energy efficient outdoor timers for car engine block heaters, Ontario Hydro President and CEO Robert Franklin announced recently.

The average engine block heater consumes 500 watts and if left to run for ten hours requires energy produced by burning seven and half pounds of coal, Franklin told members of the Canadian Electrical Association.

A million cars using their block heaters all winter requires 375,000 tons of coal.

Franklin pointed out that the block heater timer is only one example of technology that is available now to be easily adapted to help consumers use electricity more efficiently.

Details of the timer rebate program will be announced at a later date.

Recently Hydro offered a \$5 rebate on energy efficient light bulbs which are being sold through a supermarket chain. The entire shipment of 20,000 sold out within a few days, and a second shipment is selling fast.

During his speech to CEA members, Franklin called for a greater partnership between utilities and governments to encourage more efficient use of electric-

Franklin noted that while government regulation is one possible method of enforcing energy efficiency, educating the consumer to the resulting environmental, economic and social benefits remains the crucial task.


