Hair coloring

Hair coloring is both a science and an art of changing the color of hair.

Hair coloring is the addition of an artificial color to the natural pigment in the hair.

Hair lightening or bleaching, involves a partial or total removal of the natural pigment from the hair.

A few reasons for coloring or lightening hair are; to restore grey hair to its natural shade, change hair to a more attractive color, restore hair to its natural color, or to create decorative effects, such as frosting, streaking or tipping.

The advantages of hair coloring are: for women and men with premature grey hair, business people who feel that the shade of

their hair is a handicap or women and men who wish to keep a youthful appearance.

There are three types of hair coloring that you can get; temporary, semi-permanent and permanent.

Before getting a permanent color, your hairdresser should take a patch test, to see if you are allergic to the color.

After this, your hairdresser should check your scalp for cuts or scratches. If your hair is dry or brittle, you should ask your hairdresser for treatments or shampoos for dry or colored hair.

There are a whole range of colors on the market today, so ask your hairdresser which one will be best for you.
